

Farewells

We bid farewell to Mr McAllister, the Formal Depute Headteacher, and Mr Farmer, Principal Teacher of Mathematics.





Mr McAllister first came to Whitehill as Principal Teacher of Chemistry in 1973. At that time, the school was in the old building in Whitehill Street. We moved to the present building in 1977. In 1979, Mr McAllister moved to Inveralmond in Lothian as Assistant Head Teacher. He returned in 1986 as Depute Headteacher. Over the years Mr McAllister has been responsible for S5/6 curriculum and discipline, the timetable, staff, health and safety, students and administration. He also taught many science and chemistry classes. Mr McAllister has been seconded to Education Headquarters to support all Glasgow schools so that they can make the best use of the SEEMIS computer system, including Click'n'go registration, an area of administration in which he has a keen interest. He said, "We now do more and more things electronically. We're moving into an electronic age and using systems to communicate with SQA, other schools and the local authority."

Mr Farmer joined the school as Principal Teacher of Mathematics in 2004 from St Columba's in Clydebank. Mr Farmer has greatly enjoyed his time here with all his classes. He enjoys seeing pupils trying hard and improving. "The thing I've noticed is that, even with pupils finding Maths difficult, they do want to learn and try hard." Mr Farmer is moving to Knightswood Secondary as Principal Teacher of Mathematics.

Also leaving us is Mrs Isabel McDougall who has been the cleaner for the English department for 30 years. Mrs McDougall has decided to take her well-earned retirement from Christmas.

We wish them all well.

The first years attended 'The Nine Lives of Roddy Hogg' and the seniors' performance was 'Friends Disunited'. All plays were performed by the Baldy Bane Theatre Company. The plays were really well received by the pupils and are a great way to Miss McCracken learn about important issues.

In November, the whole school took part in the Radio Clyde Cash for Kids appeal "Strip for Scotland". UNIVERSITY PREPARATION PROGRAMME


