

Pre 5 Mini WIZ - 8 & 9 August 2006

Whitehill New Learning Community in partnership with Strathclyde University are currently organising a unique and exciting programme for

pupils who will be going into Primary 1 in August.

The Pre 5 Mini Wiz (Whitehill Improvement Zone) will take place on 8 & 9 August 2006 in the excellent venue of Haghill Park

Primary School.

The programme is aimed at preparing pupils and parents for this major transition.

They will take part in:

- How to support your child's learning
 - Health-food for thought-Snacks and lunches.
- Adventure and physical challenges
- Develop language skills
- Making friends

This project will be closely monitored and evaluated with the aim of it being established as an annual event.

All of the associated Whitehill NLC primaries are participating in the Active Schools Playground games leader (Activ8ors) training for P6 children. The pupils learn all the aspects of a playground games leader, including the importance of being a good role model, team work, discipline, organisational skills and including all children in games. Once the children are trained they are known as Activ8ors and mainly lead playground games, including skipping and parachute, and team games to P1-P4 children. The Active School Coordinator will support the Activ8ors out in the playground for 2 weeks, however, school support staff take a lead role, liasing and assisting them in the playground and also voting for the Activ8or of the month.

"More Children More Active More Often"

- There will be a Summer Activity Programme for P1-P7 children during the school holidays run by Active Schools. This will be the 5th Active Schools holiday programme since we have been in post and will engage children in physical activities such as Play, Team Combat, Athletics and Street dance.
- Also this summer, primary school playgrounds in the Whitehill NLC will have Playground games markings painted to encourage the children to be more

physically active. These markings were agreed through consultation with schools head teachers, pupil councils and will supplement the Activ8or playground games training.
