The plan will also be given to senior management so that they can also help make sure all the targets are achieved.

### **Prefects**

The new prefect rota has been made and will be given out shortly. Andrew (the schools secretary) has made sure that all prefects are involved in this. Some of the roles will include supervising the junior years at interval and lunch breaks, attending meetings every two weeks to report back on any issues they have come across and overall maintain standards and expectations within the school.

This year is the first year Whitehill Secondary has provided the opportunity of a residential study weekend to Blairvadach. 32




### Show Racism The Red Card
